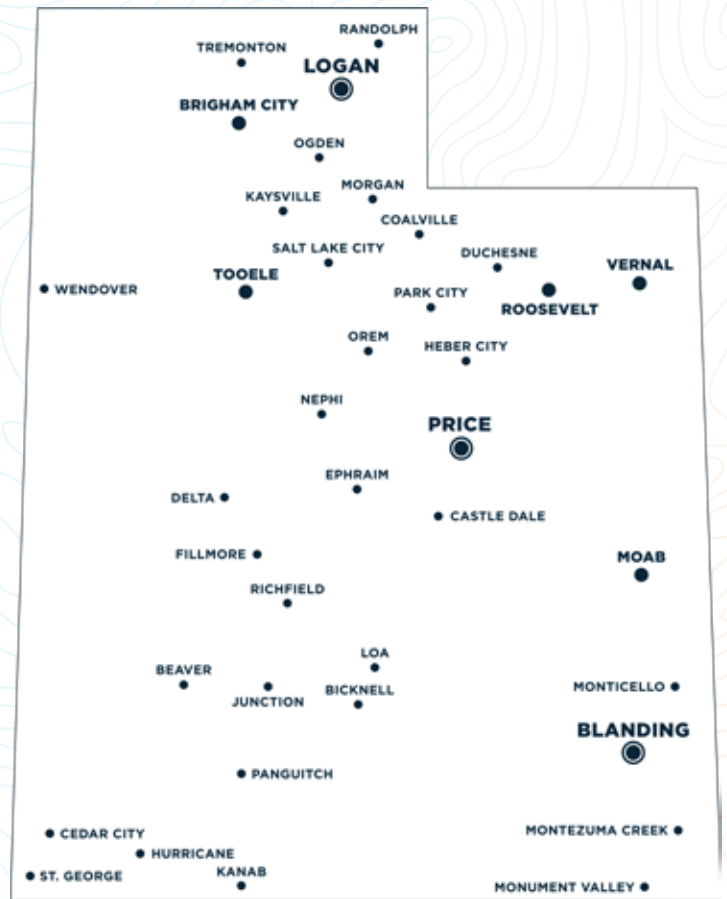

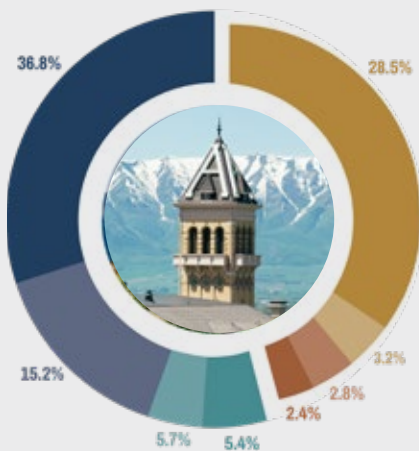
Athletics
